....As we left the parking lot in our van, we turned to head toward Queen Street and as we headed through the light, Ricardo shouted, "Mr. Finn, stop, can we please go back?" I wasn't sure what he meant. (I instantly recalled the scene from 'Miracle on 34th Street' when the little girl tells Mr. Galley to stop for the house Santa had delivered). But, he then said that he had seen a boy sitting on the sidewalk with a sign asking for help outside the store and felt a need to see if he/we could help him some how. As we made our way back, Ricardo said that something just 'made me notice him....he seemed to be my age.' All the kids took the grabbed food they had with them, along with some fruit that you had sent to Youthworks and placed it all in a bag. When we gave the food to the boy, who looked indeed to be about fifteen, he turned to us and his face seemed to reflect an image of the suffering Jesus. He smiled and as we left he gave us the 'peace' sign. As we drove away with everyone in tears and many in sobs, it was apparent that 'service to the poor' had found a very personal meaning for us. Since then, the peace sign has served both as a reminder of service performed and a reminder of service to which we remain called

I know that our time with you, Br. Ken, Dom, Sam, Matt, all your volunteers and, most of all, your patrons, has shown us how to see the face of Christ in all his people. The joy with which you so faithfully live out God's call to serve the poor not only pumped us up with a 'servant' energy during our days at St. Francis Table, but has sent us on with an awareness of our need to continue serving and to bring that energy to others. One of our youth, Nick, summed up our experience by saying, "I never thought I'd see so many of the corporal works of mercy happening in just an hour over lunch." So not only did we see so many, but we learned that we, ourselves, can be messengers of God's mercy and witnesses for God's living love in the world.
